

Crescent of Betrayal

The Flight 93 Memorial Project will announce on July 28th whether it is going to build what had originally been called the Crescent of Embrace design (seen below, overlaid on Google Earth). All of the features detailed below remain fully intact in the superficially altered Bowl of Embrace redesign. Given the urgent public need to know, World Ahead Media is allowing author Alec Rawls to make a draft version of his forthcoming book, *Crescent of Betrayal*, freely available to the public in the form of several downloadable PDF documents that will be freely transferrable until the print version of his book comes out in late August. 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Temporary entrance to the Flight 93 Memorial:
Take Lambertsville Rd. north from Shanksville PA,
or south from the Lincoln Highway (US 30). Turn
southeast on Skyline Rd. into the memorial.

Red arrow shows the path Flight 93 followed to ground. Where the flight path "breaks the circle" (at the end of the Entry Portal Walkway) sits the 44th memorial glass block on the flight path, matching the number of passengers, crew, AND terrorists. It defines a hidden exact Mecca-orientation of the giant crescent. (Swing the upper tip of the **aqua line** in 1.8° and it hits the end of the Entry Portal Walkway).

Red X marks Flight 93's point of impact.

The Memorial Wall: A separate upper section of Memorial Wall is centered exactly on the bisector of the giant crescent, placing it exactly in the position of the star on an Islamic crescent and star flag. Three glass blocks on the upper wall mark the date: 9/11/2001. The date goes to the star on the Islamic flag. The date goes to the terrorists.

Minor cosmetic changes in the "Bowl of Embrace" redesign leave these and many other Islamic and terrorist memorializing features fully intact.

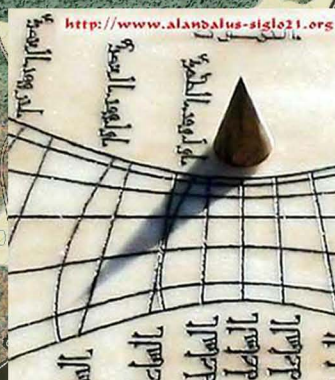
"The Gateway":

Entry road passes through the crescents of trees that surround the crescent shaped Tower of Voices: a year-round accurate Islamic prayer time sundial (see inset below). A line across the most obtruding tips of the Tower crescents (**aqua arrow**) points 1.8° north of Mecca, exactly replicating the near Mecca orientation of the half mile wide central crescent.

Unnatural beauty: Ponds created by strip mining.

The "Crescent of Embrace": Face into the crescent to face Mecca. The superimposed **green circle** is from Islam.com. It shows the "qibla" direction (the direction to Mecca, which Muslims are supposed to face for prayer) for Somerset (ten miles from the crash-site). Notice that if a person stands at the midpoint between the two most obtruding tips of the crescent structure (**aqua dot**) and faces into the center of the Crescent of Embrace (**aqua arrow**) he will be facing almost precisely in the qibla direction. This overt orientation of the crescent points slightly north of Mecca (1.8°).

A crescent that Muslims face into to face Mecca is called a "mihrab" and is the central feature around which every mosque is built.



Left inset image: a traditional Islamic sundial. The tip of the shadow is just reaching the outer curved vertical, indicating time for Islamic afternoon prayers. The similarity to the Tower of Voices part of the Flight 93 Memorial, right, is overt. Shadow calculations confirm that the Tower array is an Islamic sundial. (South is at the top in both images.)
